## Membership Requirements: Section One Division 39 of the APA

Applicants must have fulfilled the psychoanalytic training criteria listed below. Training may have been obtained at one or more institutes, or the requirements may have been fulfilled privately. Since institute or similar formal training has not always been readily available, colleagues who have fulfilled the preponderance (if not every detail) of the membership requirements in an organized, private, training program that is essentially equivalent to institute training are eligible for membership. Other colleagues who have attended institutes in which training did not include some aspects of the requirements, such as a full four years of coursework, may also be eligible. Each application is evaluated individually with emphasis on the overall thrust and scope of the training program as it relates to the membership requirements.

Membership in the Section of Psychologist-Psychoanalyst Practitioners is open to all individuals who are Fellows, Members, or Allied Professional Members of Division 39 and who meet the following minimum psychoanalytic training requirements.

Candidate membership in the Section of Psychologist-Psychoanalytic Practitioners is open to all individuals who are candidates in training in which they are working toward meeting the following minimum psychoanalytic training requirements.

### **Psychoanalytic Training Minimum Requirements:**

Four years of psychoanalytic study to include;

1. Personal Analysis:

300 hours minimum at three times or more per week.

2. Supervised Psychoanalytic Treatment:

A total of 200 hours of supervision received from at least two qualified psychoanalysts (i.e. individuals whose psychoanalytic training fulfills the Section One requirements) with patients seen at least three times per week. Supervision must have been primarily on a weekly basis with each supervisor, and each supervisory experience must focus on work with a

single case seen continuously for an extended period of time. The total supervised experience that meets this requirement will deal with at least two and no more than four analytic treatment cases.

### 3. Curriculum:

Four years (or equivalent) of psychoanalytic courses and seminars including (at minimum) theory of mental functioning, theory of technique, and case seminars. If obtained privately, the course work must constitute a coherent program of study comparable to an institute's curriculum and must be taught by qualified psychoanalysts.
